Tejaswi eclipses Anita's mark

MUMBAI: Juhu Vile Parle Gymkhana's Tejaswi Shetty smashed Anita Sood's 15-year old mark in the women's 100 metres freestyle on the concluding of the Otters Club Open Swimming Gala.

Tejaswi who is a swimmer of national repute stroked powerfully to win the race in a time of 1:02:73. Anita Sood had set the mark way back in 1985 with a time of 1:03:05. Tejaswi bagged the individual titles in the girls under-15 and women's sections.

Parikshit Shetty who studies in the eighth standard at Bhavan's (Andheri) continued his winning spree when he set two more records.

There were three more records to fall on an eventful final day.

The meet received an overwhelming response with over 300 swimmers participating.

Otters Club's Riyad Palia who won a number of events claimed the individual titles in the boys under-15 and men's section.

MUMBAI: Khar Gymkhana claimed the women's and girls championships in the 28th YMCA swimming gala at Agripada on Sunday.
